
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## PRACTICAL INFORMATION

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## *SOCIAL ACTIVITIES*

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On Saturday 10, in the afternoon, a visit at the historical centre of Naples (a UNESCO heritage site since 1994) is scheduled. The meeting will be at 16.00 in Piazza del Gesù Nuovo. The tour will start by visiting the beautiful Church of the Gesù, a wonderful testimony of the Neapolitan baroque; then the tour will continue to Spaccanapoli, the famous Decumanus of Naples, which splits Naples into two. The next stop will be the Basilica of Santa Chiara in Piazza San Domenico Maggiore. The visit will end in San Gregorio Armeno, the most famous street in the Naples historical centre, characterized by the craftsmanship of the Shepherds. There a tasting of limoncello and sfogliatelle will be offered.

The tour should last 2 hours.

The desire to participate to the touristic tour must be expressed in advance given that the cost of the tour depends on the number of participants (in any case the tour would not be more expensive than 30 euros per participant).
